THE VOICE

An invitation to the future...

"When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly, from heaven, there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting.

Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability." Act 2:1-4

Pentecost Sunday is just around the corner, Sunday, May 23rd.

What is Pentecost? Why would you know? It is not that Pentecost gets a lot of press. People don't decorate their homes for Pentecost or buy each other Pentecost presents. So what is Pentecost, and why should we care?

On Christmas, Christians celebrate the birth of Christ. We recall God Immanuel, God with us. On Easter, Christians celebrate the Resurrection of Christ, the promise of resurrection given to all God's people. And on Pentecost, we celebrate the Holy Spirit – the gift of God's comfort, power, and strength given to God's people.

In the Hebrew Scripture, the Jewish people celebrated a holiday known as the "Festival of Weeks" (see Exodus 32 and Deuteronomy 16). While the Temple stood in Jerusalem, the celebration of Shavuot (Festival of Weeks) occurred 50 days after the celebration of Passover. The Greek-speaking Jews of the first century called the festival "Pentecost," meaning "fiftieth day."

According to the book of Acts, it was on the day of Pentecost that the disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to tell the story of Jesus. Amazingly, all who heard it, regardless of their language, understood what was being said.

Christians have come to understand Pentecost as the birthday of the Church. But it is much more than a historical event. On this day, we invite the Holy Spirit to fill us and transform us. Furthermore, we invite the Spirit to lead us into the future.

In our confession of faith, the third article of the Apostles Creed declares the work of the Holy Spirit. In Luther's explanation of the article, we remember how the Spirit works in our lives.

"I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. Similarly, He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. In this Christian church, He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the Last Day, He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ."

Just as the Holy Spirit turned the lives of the disciples upside down, leading them into a new way of life, so the Spirit leads us into a new future. Join us for the celebration of Pentecost. It is Sunday, May 23rd. As you are able, wear red!

A week at camp is often the highlight of a young person's summer! While Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp has had to adjust their summer programming with the impact of COVID-19. Last summer, we were able to attend in two separate groups and we had a blast learning and growing in faith and in God's beautiful creation! We've hear so much about it throughout the winter, we decided to doffer it again this summer! Join Liz and Jackie for an incredible Christ-centered experience in a retreat-style format.

What does a retreat-style camp look like? While there, a camp staff member will guide guests through the various activities that camp offers (swimming, Bible study, worship,

canoeing, archery, sailing, hiking, etc.!). At camp, groups will remain distanced to the best of their ability, with specific mealtime procedures, scheduled activities, and more as guided by the CDC and Flathead County Health Department.

Jackie Bartz & Liz Swenson would like to take a couple groups of youth to experience camp:

- July 18-23 A full week adventure for older youth (8th grade and older)
- August 1-4 A shorter trip (4 days/3 nights) for 3rd grade to 7th grade.

By splitting up the groups, we will be better able to gage levels of activities, bedtimes, bible studies, etc. for each group.

FLBC requires us to bring 1 adult female (myself) and 1 adult male as chaperones for the time at camp as well as masks for all (to be worn only when

needed in doors and when in close proximity to other groups). More information on specific forms and info will be distributed closer to the beginning of summer.

As camp is trying to limit outside folks dropping in, we will travel as a group using a 15 passenger van to transport our group to and from camp. Please note that as we will be traveling together, social distancing will not be a possibility during transport, but we will follow camp rules for safety and social distancing once on site.

***WELCA (Women of the ELCA) also offers camp scholarships to any student who needs financial assistance to attend Bible Camp. Applications are available in the narthex and can be turned into the church office.

Registration for camp is due two weeks prior to the start date of each trip (June 28th and July 5th) to the church office as we will be registering as a group!

Church Council Meeting Summary April 20, 2021

The Church Council met on Tuesday, April 20, 2021, at 6 pm. The Council adopted the agenda for this meeting and approved the minutes from the March Council meeting.

- Opening devotions were led by Pastor Kendra regarding hospitality from a biblical perspective and how that relates to partnering with secular institutions to move forward with ministry in regard to the Church property.
- Beth Johnson, Treasurer, gave the March financial report. The Council authorized forwarding the benevolence calculated based on February giving to benevolence partners.
- The Council approved the family leave policy as revised by the Personnel Committee with an amendment made by Ryan Holm regarding military order submission in the event of a military leave.
- Cody Salo, Church Council Representative for the Property Development Committee, reported that the Request for Proposal was published for crafting a development plan for the vacant portion of the Church property.
- Glenn Erickson was re-elected to the Perpetual Fund Committee.
- The Council has accepted a bid to seal cracks and re-stripe the entire Church parking lot.
- The Council will maintain financial support of the ORLC preschool through the end of 2021 at the level paid during the first three months in 2021.
- Jan Martin, Council President, provided information about forming a Transition Team Committee in response to Pastor Arne's pending retirement. The Council has been tasked with appointing members of the Transition Team Committee.
- The Council has authorized interviewing and negotiating a contract with an Interim Pastor appointed by the Synod.
- The Council approved the authorization of Holy Cow Consulting to perform a congregational survey as part of the transition process.
