Pastoral Care Review

One of the primary tasks of the interim pastor is the review and evaluation of all ministry programs. The Holy Cow survey gave us some early direction in this, focusing on worship and music, some basic communication issues, and better information sharing. Next up, all aspects of pastoral care.

What is Pastoral Care?

It may sound like something that just a pastor does, but at Our Redeemer's, there are many people involved in providing faith-based care to those among us who are elderly, ill, struggling with significant change, in a time of crisis, or needing companionship. In times of emergency, like impending death, it is usually the pastor who responds, but to provide ongoing care for a congregation of this size, it takes many offering their gifts of ministry to cover all the needs.

What areas are being reviewed?

Many of the ministries that fall under Pastoral Care were overseen by Pastor Kendra. She and I had already begun reviewing and evaluating their effectiveness before her departure. Together we identified several areas where increased need was occurring, or further education of volunteers would be beneficial, or updated practices needed to be employed.

There are four aspects of care that are being focused upon:

- 1. Visitation coverage and updating the homebound list
- 2. The Eucharistic Ministers program
- 3. Care for those who are hospitalized or in hospice care
- 4. Updating and expanding the prayer ministry of the congregation

Visitation coverage and updating the homebound list

Updating the list of those who need regular pastoral visits is always a part of an interim, with the goal being a detailed list prepared for the new pastor. I'll be coordinating with Lori Walter and a couple of long-time members to finalize this list and then create a schedule of regular visits by LPAs, Eucharistic Ministers, other interested visitors, Baird Linke, and myself. Often someone who has been a vital active member of a congregation can, through the loss of a spouse or mobility, suddenly find themselves very lonely and in need of this kind of care. If you know of people who would benefit from regular visits, please let Lori or me know.

The Eucharistic Ministers program

This is a group of lay people who are trained to bring Holy Communion to our homebound members. It's been a while since they had any continuing education or a chance to share their experiences with their peers, so a refresher workshop will take place in February or March. We can use more people in this vital ministry. If you're interested, please let me know.

Care for those who are hospitalized or in hospice care

This part of pastoral care has already been reformatted and is working well. LPA Lori Bigwood-Pecarina has overseen this project. Currently, there is a weekly rotation of volunteers who check in with the hospital to see if there are any Our Redeemer's members hospitalized. If there are, they pay them a visit and report back to me on the person's status and if I need to offer follow-up care.

If we have members under hospice care, I share this with the volunteers, and these folks are regularly visited too. A reminder: the hospital does not tell us if you are receiving care, and we want to be able to journey with you in a health crisis. Please let us know how we can help.

Updating and expanding the prayer ministry of the congregation

This is a twofold endeavor, with LPA Lisa Williams-Mathews helping to sort through the prayer list that is used weekly in worship and appears in The Voice, while I will be focusing on updating the ministry description for the coordination of the Our Redeemer's "prayer chain" and expanding the number of people involved in this ministry. Currently, this is a very underutilized way of walking with one another in times of need and rejoicing with our sisters and brothers in times of joy. An active, highly subscribed prayer chain is a strong source of connection in a congregation. Look for more on this in the bulletin and e-news in the coming weeks as we seek to expand the number of people involved in this ministry. This is a ministry that everyone can be involved in...no experience needed!

Pastor Trina Johnsten opened the meeting with prayer.

Beth Johnson reviewed the financial report for December that Sarah Magee prepared. 2021 giving was down for the general and building funds; however, there was a balance in the checking account at the end of the year. Council used the cash balance, interest earned, and some external gifts to zero out the payables for the year. Benevolence wasn't paid for April - December 2021.

The balance of John Wright's estate gift to the church will be used to install an electronic door opening system for the North entrance, 12% of the original gift to our benevolence partners, and the balance to remain in external gifts.

Pastor Trina reported on her ministry activities for the past month. Part of her role as Interim Pastor is to review all ministry aspects of ORLC (such as education, pastoral care, organization, and financial). Prior to Pastor Kendra's leaving, they worked on aspects of Pastoral Care, including visitation coverage and updating the homebound list, the Eucharistic Ministers program, care for those hospitalized or in hospice care, and updating and expanding the prayer chain ministry of the congregation. It appears that the prayer ministry could be expanded to better support members in need of special prayers. An organized, active, and highly utilized prayer chain is a strong source of connection throughout a congregation.

Jan Martin reported that the Property Development Team will hold an open neighborhood meeting via Zoom on February 8 at 6:00pm. She hopes it will be well attended by members of ORLC and the neighborhood. The meeting can be accessed through the city website. Jan will establish a team of volunteer content experts to begin compiling a plan that can serve as a blueprint when talks of selling ORLC's land move forward. Important aspects of such a plan include covering the cost of the mortgage, access to church property via Horseshoe Bend Drive, relieving the church of responsibility for upkeep, and that the land will be used for low and middle-income housing.

Beth submitted a response to the Audit Committee regarding the audit for years 2019 and 2020.

Jan reported that a Search Committee has been tasked with procuring a new Preschool Director as soon as possible. Trudy Burke is retiring at the end of the school year.

On behalf of the congregation, the Council extended their appreciation to Craig Erickson, immediate Past President, for his years of service. He will continue his work chairing the Generosity Committee. Other members going off the Council are Ryan Holm and Drew Sielbach. New council members will be elected at the Annual Congregational Meeting on January 30 at 9:45am.

The meeting closed with prayer.



An update from the ORLC Call Committee.

We shared earlier that the first main task of the Call Committee is the write up and completion of our *Ministry Site Profile*. This is the document through which we will convey the unique spirit, gifts, talents, and challenges of our

congregation and community to any potential candidate. And while this document is still a work in progress, the goal is to have it close to completion by the end of this month.

As the *Ministry Site Profile* nears completion, nominations will be invited from members of the congregation. Nominees for the position of Pastor must be on the clergy roster of the ELCA or eligible



full communion partner denominations. Those include the Presbyterian Church (USA), Reformed Church in America, United Church of Christ, The Episcopal Church, The Moravian Church, and United Methodist Church. Nomination forms will be offered to the congregation for this purpose, or members can provide names to the committee in writing, accompanied by as much information as possible, so as to aid the synod office in identifying the nominees. Nominees are not to be contacted by either the call committee or by the individual making the nomination. Rather, the synod office will determine if nominees in question are open and available for call. Receiving a nomination does not guarantee that the candidate will be presented to the Call Committee. Other factors of congregational fit and suitability are considered by the synod staff.

There are literally thousands of pastors in the ELCA and there is no way the Synod can know all of them and whether they might be the perfect candidate for ORLC. But you know this congregation. You know a good sermon when you hear one. If you are traveling these days and you have an opportunity to worship at an ELCA congregation either on line, or in person, and you hear or see a pastor that you think would be the perfect fit for us, why not scribble down some notes on what impressed you about the person, and let the Call Committee know? Forms for submitting a nomination are available by the church office, as well as the church website.

Thank you for your continued prayers for the Call Committee as we learn, grow, work, and pray together through this call process.
