OUR REDEEMER'S LUTHERAN CHURCH

THE VOICE

The Our Redeemer's Property Development Committee has been on a long and educational journey, and we are profoundly grateful for the support and patience this congregation has granted us along the way.

It was over five years ago that we as a congregation started earnestly exploring ways in which our land could be used to serve a community need. We the church are landowners, but we are not developers, and so the pursuit began for a mission-driven development partner whose mission aligned with the church's. Seeing the housing crisis we are now in approaching five years ago, this committee reached out to various community partners working in the affordable housing realm. These partners and the relationships established have been significant and life-giving to this committee and the congregation. Community relationships created in this process have led to new church memberships and engagement on this committee. It has been an engaging process and much has been gained and learned through it.

As a reminder, in 2020, Our Redeemer's entered a partnership with Rocky Mountain Development Council (RMDC), Helena Area Habitat for Humanity, the YWCA, and the City of Helena to apply for a Department of Commerce planning grant, which we were awarded. This allowed the partnership to engage in extensive conversation and planning to develop a master plan for the property and resulted in adding Trust Montana, a community land trust, to the partnership. The information developed through this grant served as the basis for a grant application to the City of Helena in 2023 made by RMDC, the selected lead developer, on behalf of the partnership. The grant request made was for \$2.4 million in seed money for RMDC to purchase the land from the church and to install Horseshoe Bend Rd, to access the property and realize the city's requirement that Benton Ave. and Green Meadow Dr. be linked by this connector road. The city granted RMDC \$1.58M for the project. This funding was welcomed but fell short of the projected need. In the interim period several additional head winds have come into play.

Helena Area Habitat for Humanity has been able to acquire 107 acres of land in East Helena where they are visioning a mixed-income neighborhood

of up to 1,700 homes. It is the largest land development project by a Habitat for Humanity affiliate in the world! We rejoice in this and fully support their efforts to create affordable housing in our community. At the same time, it means that their staff and board are fully engaged on a much larger and extremely challenging project. Additionally, the YWCA's executive director has left her post, and the organization is currently being led by an interim director. They have their hands full maintaining their existing programs and building. Lastly, as we have all seen, the economy does not look the same as it did five years ago. Construction costs, interest rates, insurance rates, utility costs, maintenance costs, labor rates, and property taxes have all risen significantly. At the same time, the funding mechanisms used by affordable housing developers have not kept pace.

The reality of these headwinds has led us to the point where RMDC has determined they are unable to move forward on the project. The committee has been in communication with two alternative affordable housing developers who have given us the same message – the project requires somewhere between \$5-\$7.5M of capital upfront to realize. Through these conversations we have learned a lot. We have a renewed respect for the complex financing models these affordable housing developers navigate and continued respect for their efforts. We respect the work of each of our partners and understand that each one of them must move forward in their missions on a clearly navigable path.

This committee is disheartened but not disbanding. We are open to where the Holy Spirit is leading this congregation. We will continue to learn all we can about property development and will continue to reach out to potential partners and learn from similar projects. We believe that someday the vision for this property will become clear and the path forward straight. We pray for that discernment.

This workshop is perfect for students who have not studied the Bible before and will teach mature Bible readers new Biblical concepts and overarching themes in the Bible to enrich their faith.



If you come to worship at the 8:30am worship service, the first people you will probably meet are our personable ushers, Tom and Edward Johnson, who will greet you with a smile and a friendly "good morning" or "hello." Tom and Edward are brothers and were raised on a farm east of Helena. They come from a big family, thirteen in all, five boys and eight girls. Tom, the older brother, remembers they transferred their membership in the fall of



1964 from St. John's Lutheran here in town, originally a Swedish Augustana Lutheran Church, and joined Our Redeemer's, which came out of the Norwegian Lutheran Church of the American Lutheran Church.

Three out of four Sundays, you'll find Tom and Ed ushering. Why do they do it? Ed said, "I like it. I don't consider it work. It's fun!" Tom said, 'I'm a people person, ushering is a way to get to know more people and develop deeper relationships with other members. It's a way to help out." "Plus," Ed added, "you can sit in the back!"

Tom remembers one service where there was a medical emergency with a member with heart problems. Since he was an EMT and served as a firefighter at Ft. Harrison for 34 years in the guard, he was able to assist. Ed says he enjoys helping people, like bringing their walkers to some members at the end of the service. Ed works for the city of Helena and did the building inspections on the new Our Redeemer's building.

Both Tom and Edward have served on the church council. Tom said some of those meetings were contentious, but he could freely share his views, especially his Biblical perspectives. Ed said with a wry smile, "Some of them won't stop talking, and some meetings went on and on." I think both enjoyed their time on the church council.

Edward attended the Caregiver's Support Group when his wife Millie had Parkinson's and cancer. Millie was Catholic and recently died this summer, having been married 36 years to Edward and together raising four kids. Tom and his wife also raised four children. Ed shared a tender story about a routine that he and Millie had before he left for work each morning. He said they would say the Our Father prayer together. After Millie died, Ed still goes to the cemetery daily and says the Our Father with her.

We are indebted to dedicated servants like Edward and Tom who freely give of their time to usher. The church is really about relationships: relationships with one another and our relationship with God. It sure feels good to have Tom and Edward welcoming us to God's house of prayer on Sundays.

They encourage others if they would like to usher, to join them in this ministry of hospitality. Jason will even give you a training on ushering so you, too, can extend the hand of fellowship and friendship to present members and new folks who worship with us. Perhaps whole families can do it together! You, too, can develop deeper relationships with sisters and brothers by ushering. And besides, like Ed says, "It's fun and you can sit in the back!"

From Heather White's book, 60 Days to a Greener Life, on learning the law of simplicity and consistency: "We need substantial policy and market solutions, but sometimes we overlook an important point. Individual action can create **culture change**, so these comprehensive strategies work."

"Tiny changes create momentum...my favorite resource is James Clear's *Atomic Habits*. He reminds us that 'we often dismiss small changes because they don't seem to matter very much in the moment.' However, if we create systems that allow for small changes, their impact compounds over time. Our daily actions make up our lives. If we focus on tiny, consistent actions, we can make time itself a powerful agent for transformation of our individual and collective experiences."

"Another way to think about creating a new habit is focusing on cue, action, and reward, as Charles Duhigg writes about in *The Power of Habit*. This means that something reminds you to take action (the cue), you take the action, and then your brain is rewarded for that action. Naming the reward is powerful enough to create a new habit. In the context of living a greener life, the feeling of positive contribution to the planet and your community can be the reward."

Solar and More

Jerry Hoover, Nelson Bock, and Herb Kulow, representing the Solar and More Committee, presented a proposal for installing solar panels on the roof of Our Redeemer's Lutheran Church. This proposal will be presented at the annual meeting **on February 9**, seeking approval of a \$170,000 loan to pursue this project. Because Northwest Energy provides grant reimbursements for nonprofits (50-90%) to assist with solar projects, and because the Inflation Reduction Act also includes provision for direct pay to nonprofits (30%) for solar projects, it appears to be a good time to pursue this project, which will provide 80% of the electricity needs for the church building and pay for itself in about two years. No contract will be signed until an initial grant from North Western Energy is awarded.

Financial Report for December

The Council approved the payment of \$13,604.50 to the Building Fund and \$8524.06 to the Dedicated Fund, leaving a balance of \$13,705.69. Although no further amount was given to the Synod, it should be noted that Synod gifts for 2024 have totaled more than \$18,000, considerably more than has been donated in recent years.

Staff and Pastor's Report

Staff reports were submitted in written form and will appear in the Annual Report available to the congregation.

Pastor Trina reported that the Preschool board has recommended an adjustment to next year's schedule, expanding offerings for 3 and 4-year-olds. They have also recommended an increase in prices to be more in line with similar preschools in the area.

Annual Meeting

Ballots are being prepared for the Annual Meeting on February 9. Congregation members will vote on nominations for Council, Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp delegates, a Perpetual Fund member, and Synod Assembly delegates.

Council Training for New Members

A training session will be held for new Council members sometime after the Annual Meeting in February.



College Scholarship Application

Qualifications:

Payment of Scholarship:

The scholarship will be disbursed to the institution in one payment - \$1,000 at the beginning of your school year.

- 1. Student must carry a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester.
