Montana Synod Vision, Calling, and Values

<u>Vision</u>

A Montana/N. Wyoming Synod that is continuously building up and equipping one another for the ministry of the Gospel of Jesus Christ in people's lives, their communities, the synod, Christ's wider church and God's world.

Calling

Equipping the followers of Christ of the Montana/N. Wyoming for ministry of:

- 1) Building Up the Body of Christ; AND
- 2) Living Christ's Love into the World

Values

- 1. Proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ's grace and love for all
- 2. Engaging in God's justice for the World, especially the "least of these" (Mt 25)
- 3. "Walking humbly with God" in all we do and say (Micah 6:8)
- 4. Pursuing "unity in harmony with diversity" across church and community
- 5. Promoting relationships and collaboration across the synod and wider church

Early in June, I attended the Annual Assembly for our ELCA Montana Synod. I was stimulated and moved by the powerful reminders that we at Our Redeemer's Lutheran Church are a part of the much larger whole of God's Kingdom. We support, and are supported by, the work and prayers of 28,000 baptized members of 120 Montana congregations. Through them and with them we shine the gracefilled Gospel light of Christ into the lives of people throughout our state.

Our synod passes about a third of its income through to the ELCA at the national level, which comprises 8.900 congregations. Those gifts help bring God's tangible presence to people across our country and throughout the world. Additionally, we share in ministry with six Christian denominations who are "full communion partners." including the Presbyterian-USA, Episcopal, and United Methodist churches.

This expansive view of who we are and what we are called to do is reflected in the synod's focus on "Equipping for Ministry." The synod's logo contains that concise mission statement. It is based on Ephesians 4:11-13:

"The gifts [Jesus] gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ." (NRSV)

The Synod's statements of vision, calling, and values strongly reflect this focus (see following). In her report, Bishop Jungling talked about how this focus has always been appropriate, but it is becoming increasingly imperative as the church struggles to provide pastors when and where needed. She reported that. "...over 50% of our congregations are without pastors right now. And with the baby boomers retiring younger, I am expecting more pastors to leave in the next two years either through retirement or transfer out of synod."

I am especially interested in how Ephesians 4 elaborates on Jesus's objectives for equipping "the saints" (i.e., Christ's church, us). Different bible translations use different words, but the NRSV includes equipping:

- ...for the work of ministry
- ...for building up the body of Christ in love, with the aim of producing a unified, mature, and complete faith in and knowledge of Jesus
- ...that we might "grow up" into Christ through speaking the truth in love
- ...that we might be renewed into the likeness of God "in true righteousness and holiness"

We at ORLC are doing an admirable job at equipping for ministry. For example, consider Baird Linke and Shawn Juers, two current seminarians with Our Redeemer's origins. I brainstormed a few more examples shown in the following table; there certainly are many more.

The gifts God has given you are needed in this world now more than ever. Do you feel equipped to serve; to grow into the likeness of God; to help build up, heal, strengthen this congregation, this community, and this world through relationship with the Savior of the World? How could you and your family become better equipped? How could we at Our Redeemer's become better equipped and better equippers? Please share your thoughts. I would love to hear them, and they would very likely serve to build up the body of Christ.

Financial Review

Receipts for the ministry fund totaled \$45,102 during the month of May, which was \$6,418 more than May 2022. Building fund donations totaled \$8,716, which was \$405 more than May 2022 but \$2,217 less than the monthly mortgage payment. The council voted to withhold benevolence and dedicated funds for this month. Those payments will be made at a later date. Pastor Trina will write an article for The Voice encouraging people to keep their giving up-to-date during the summer months.

Ministry Reports

- Pastor Trina reported that her health has improved, and she plans to be in the office 3-5 hours each day, Monday-Thursday. Several guest preachers will be in the pulpit throughout the summer, including the new Lutheran Campus Ministry pastor from MSU and the new pastor serving the prison ministry in Deer Lodge.
- Vacation Bible School went well. Since two-thirds of the 66 children who attended were outside the church family, this appears to be a great evangelism tool.
- Jackie Bartz and Liz Swenson continue to offer activities and support for the children and youth of our congregation. Jackie's last day at Our Redeemer's will be July 31.
- Preschool has concluded its activities for the school year but will be sponsoring four summer camps. There are about 10 openings for the fall and a very small number of openings for one summer camp at the end of July.
- Jason Callon continues to work with Pastor Trina in planning worship activities. However, beginning May 29, he limited his hours to 10-15 per week. He is now available only on evenings and weekends.

Committee Reports and Miscellaneous Items

- Property Development Committee continues to work with both the city and the county in order to access funds for the purchase of a portion of our church's property for affordable housing.
- The Perpetual Fund recently awarded funds for 2 seminary students (Shawn Juers and Baird Linke), as well as funds for postcard mailings to our church's neighbors and funds to the Hunger Team for the summer milk campaign.
- New signs have begun to appear around the church building. Others will soon be installed.
- The Council is examining ways to upgrade the security system at the church.
- The Council plans to begin work on gathering photos and contact information for a new church directory in the fall.
- Kevin Mathews attended the Synod Assembly in June.
- A new router has been placed in the administrative wing of the church. Further upgrades will be recommended for the future.
- The Constitution Task Force will present their first round of suggested changes at the 2024 annual meeting.
- Council member photos will soon appear on the new bulletin board outside the sanctuary.



Did you know... there is a team of "older guys" who meet for an hour or so every Wednesday morning and discuss any issue that comes to their mind. They often talk about folks in our church who enhance the many ORLC ministries and our mission. However, many of you might not know some of these folks because they work behind the scenes and do not seek or need any acknowledgment. So, each month one of us interviews one of the folks that come to our collective mind and shares some little-known facts about them.

Did you know... David McHaley moved to Montana after spending much of his life in San Diego, CA. As you might have guessed, he was a young surfer and served three years at Camp Pendleton in the US Marine Corps and another three years in the reserves. Subsequently, he spent another 15 vears as the owner-operator of a landscaping business with his brother. Concurrently he found time also to attend training and become a firefighter in Riverside, CA.


