  - Corrugated cardboard, aluminum and steel cans, paper, glass, plastics(1&2), yard waste, automotive waste and batteries
- 2. Helena Recycling. Within city limits. (406-457-2437)
  - Plastics (1&2), all cardboard, cans, and paper. NO GLASS Get a special bin, no sorting
  - Pick up every other week. There is a fee
- 3. Pacific Steel and Recycling. (406-442-7851)
  - Metal recycling (even rail cars!)
  - Electronic waste (computers, etc)
- 4. Other options are also available.

We will hike an out-and-back route from Priest Pass to Mullan Pass. This is a section of the Continental Divide Trail. The total out-and-back distance is five miles. The total elevation gain is under 800 feet, but there is one steep section that must be navigated downhill on the way out and uphill on the way back. This is the only

- HIKES strenuous section where footing can be challenging.

The route is interesting. It goes through a variety of habitats, including open meadows, range land, shady forests, and wetlands. It also crosses over the top of the Mullan Pass railroad tunnel and alongside an old train trestle. In June, there were many wildflowers, and we hope some of them will remain until this July hike.

We will depart from the south church parking lot at 11:00am and carpool to the trailhead, which takes 45-60 minutes. Please bring a sack lunch to eat at the trailhead before hiking and bear spray for your safety. Of course, bring water and dress appropriately for the weather that day. Blair and Gretchen Krumm

Helen Bunkowske moved to Helena in 1972 and became integral to Our Redeemer's Lutheran Church and the Helena Community shortly after that.

Raised in Minnesota on a farm without hot water, she said her parents ensured she and her seven other siblings were always involved in the Lutheran Church, Missouri Synod. After marriage

in Chicago, she and her husband moved from Chicago, Illinois, to Minneapolis, Minnesota, and then to Rapid City, South Dakota, where she worked as a nurse for various hospitals. They ran an aviation business in Minneapolis. During the war, Helen was trained as a cadet nurse in Fargo, North Dakota, and has always been passionate about caring for people wherever she went. Many of you have probably read much of her story in a recent Independent Record newspaper article about working for hospice, conducting visitations, and volunteering at St Peter's Hospital in Helena for over 50 years. She continues, "That's what the Lord put her on earth to do."



Helen and her family arrived in Helena after her husband took the local Federal Aviation Agency job. An insurance agent informed them about Our Redeemer's Lutheran Church, and they soon became an integral part of the church's fabric. She took a Parish Nurse class at Carroll College and never looked back.

Over 50 years ago, Helen joined Dorcas Circle, taught Sunday School, and now attends Sew-in Love, which sews guilts and provides support for the Friendship Center and YWCA. Her dedication to community service is unwavering, as she is still engaged in hospice and making visitations to new people in town and those in need. The impact of her visits is profound, as the people she visited have often told her -you're the first one who has come to my door.

Helen fears as a church community we really are not doing enough for older people. They need other things to do and many social activities. Some like to do wood working or wood carving, while others just like to golf or play cards. It's the fellowship that is important. People need to have someone to go with them to appointments or just lunch or dinner and do things together.

If you want to live a full and long life, Helen says to be positive and love the Lord. Next time you see Helen, say hi, smile, and have a laugh! She would enjoy your visit, and maybe, just maybe, some of her caring enthusiasm will spark you to teach Sunday School, join Sew-In-Love, or conduct a visitation and make a friend!

#### ..... Did You Know (What the Council Does)?

I really enjoy reading the "Did You Know?" articles in the Voice. I appreciate learning more about our individual members and am always inspired by the examples they set. The articles remind me of how blessed I am - we are - to share in ministry with these people. It's also good for these dedicated servants to receive a bit of recognition. However, that is certainly not why they serve, and I'm sure they accept the recognition reluctantly and with humility. I also want to take a moment to express our gratitude to the current Council members for their dedicated service to our church.


So, I thought I'd borrow the "Did You Know?" concept and apply it to the church Council. My objective is twofold: first, to educate our members who may not be especially familiar with the role of the Council in the life of our church, and, second, to ask each of you to seriously consider serving on the Council. Serving on the Council is not just a responsibility, but an opportunity for personal growth and spiritual development. Although Council elections are several months away, it's not too early to begin thinking and praying about whether God might be calling you to serve at this time in your life in this capacity. The decision is worthy of serious consideration. Council terms are three years, the Council meets once a month, and additional meetings may be required depending on whether you serve as a Council officer and/or participate in or lead special initiatives.

The Council comprises six officers (President, Past President, First and Second Vice Presidents, secretary, and treasurer), the pastor or pastors, and five at-large members. Ideally, the three-year terms of the Council members and officers are staggered such that approximately one-third of the Council rotates each year. This year, we will need to replace three members who have completed their terms.

Candidates for Council are nominated by a Nominating Committee, chaired by the Second Vice President, and which typically includes at least two outgoing Council members. Voting members of the congregation can also nominate candidates, including themselves, from the floor of the annual congregational meeting, likely to be held in February next year. Voting congregation members then fill the open Council positions at the annual meeting by a majority vote of the voting members present at the meeting.

A later newsletter will discuss the Council's functions and duties. In the meantime, please pray that God will send us leaders with the skills and passion required to continue sharing the freedom and love of Christ, and pray to discern whether one of those leaders might be you.

This 23-24 school year you filled **24,366 bags! 3,065 crates!** and a combined total of **530.40 volunteer hours!** The Hunger Team, Helena Food Share, and the wonderful children of our community are grateful and thankful!

## **Report on Montana Synod Assembly by Ingrid Childress**

Attila Folgany (Church Council member), Pastor Trina, Dennis Trotter, and I recently attended the Montana and Northern Wyoming Synod Assembly on May 31 and June 1. The theme of the Assembly was "Equipping for Doing Justice."

It opened and closed with worship, which helped to focus on Justice as the purpose of the meeting. The evening before the Assembly started, there was a vigil for Missing and Murdered Indigenous People. There was drumming and song.

The usual business included:

- Electing State Council members and officers.
- Reviewing and approving Minutes and the budget.
- The Bishop's Report.

All of this is on the Synod's website if anyone is interested. We heard about intense work to help Rocky Boy Lutheran Church and played some fun money-raising games to aid in this effort. We also heard from Pastor Aaron Decker, ELCA's Missionary with Iglesia Evangelical Lutheran in Bolivia. They have a strong Lutheran presence in that country.

There was an outstanding Bible Study on the second morning by Pastor Julia Seymour from Big Timber on the Good Samaritan Who Stopped. She is a powerful preacher who emphasized the Justice aspect beyond the story itself and into our daily lives, what Justice looks like. (I hope anyone who has a chance to hear Pastor Julia will make an effort to do so - she is awesome.)

On the whole, however, I found the general message at the Assembly was very different from what I experience as President of our Church Council. I feel Our Redeemer's is growing and looking outside our walls to serve our community and support our neighbors. We experience excitement at the opportunity to send more kids to Bible Camp; Our Vacation Bible School is bursting at the seams; we're partnering with local non-profits to support and serve the hungry and the unhoused; and the stewardship of our individual gifts is increasing allowing us to share our discipleship with those who are seeking Christian fellowship.

What I heard was "contraction" rather than "expansion." It feels as though our Synod is trying to spread itself too thin rather than using our collective strengths together to reach our rural church partners. I think we could do so much more than was envisioned at the Assembly.

I came away from the meeting feeling energized by the work being done in committees, task forces, teams, and other groups—formal and informal. Our Redeemer's is an exciting place to gather and worship. Our staff, volunteers, and members make this place unique among other churches. We are blessed to be blessings to others.

# Report on Montana Synod Assembly by Atilla Folnagy

The MT - N. WY ELCA Synod Assembly Theme was Equipping for Doing Justice. The theme resonated through many topics from discussions on the work the ELCA is doing on the Rocky Boy's Reservation to Bolivia. It struck me how the ELCA is growing the largest in the second poorest country in South America and how ELCA funds are vital to support educating pastors (usually volunteers) and other important ministries there. I found the social justice interpretation of the Parable on the Samaritan who Stopped fitting to today's society and the delivery of the talk was riveting. There were some somber moments as the assembly upheld the decision by the synod council for the holy closure of the Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Missoula. This decision was not taken lightly as there was vigorous debate and opportunity for proponents and opponents to provide opening statements and time to ask questions. The assembly also approved the Lutheran Church in Westby, MT request to leave the synod for the W. ND ELCA synod which made sense as Main Street is literally the MT-ND border. I enjoyed getting to know Pastor Trina and Ingrid better and meeting other pastors and attendees. I recommend that if the events at the synod assembly sound interesting, please consider joining the council for the opportunity to represent Our Redeemer's Lutheran Church.

#### **Financial Review and Action**

Our Redeemer's continues to be faithful to its mission with giving this year. General receipts for May were \$43,391, and Building Fund receipts were \$7815. The Council agreed to pay the following: \$7,814.72 to the Building Fund, \$6,917.97 to the Dedicated Fund, and \$1,712.62 to Benevolence. These payments keep us up-to-date on all obligations and leave a cash balance of \$32,257.93. The Council once again thanks the congregation for its generosity in supporting the mission of this church.

#### **Personnel Committee Report**

Sharon Haugen, Lori Chase, and Lynda Hanson reported their progress updating the personnel policy manual. The group meets biweekly to make the church's policies conform to state and federal regulations. However, they recognize the difference in dealing with church staff and remain sensitive to those concerns. They have divided the manual into three segments and are now seeking input from the Council on the first third of that manual. 
