Questionnaire Results

In August, a questionnaire was mailed and emailed to all Our Redeemer's Lutheran Church families with Middle School and High School students. The purpose of this questionnaire was to ask important questions about youth ministry here at the church. This provided a reflection of the past and the desires for the future. Your thoughts were heard and valued.

Most people expressed joy and appreciation to the youth ministry of the past and where it can go in the future. A summary of what was found in the questionnaire is generally as many would expect. Parents and youth are involved in some, but not all activities. The most popular offerings that people participate in are social opportunities. It was seen reflected in most questionnaires that youth look for the 'fun' and the food that comes with all offerings. Many youth want to have fun incorporated in educational opportunities as a way to get to know other youth outside of sports and school, and having it be something that their friends outside of the church might like to participate in. In addition to 'fun' and food, another very important aspect to youth is service opportunities. Many youth that are not concerned with finding friends at church see that this is the most valuable offering. Volunteering in the community and fundraising for charities fosters spiritual growth by showing how much difference one can make for others.

Some great things that should not change were heard over and over again! Sunday school and Vacation Bible School were very positive and informative programs for their children coming into Middle School and the Confirmation program. In addition, the Confirmation content helped the youth understand the Bible, religion and their faith better through education and the activities. Along with Sunday School, Vacation Bible School and Confirmation, Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp (FLBC) was another extremely strong area where youth find spiritual growth. It was said that FLBC is a 'home away from home.' Many said that FLBC is something that kickstarted their faith again, created a desire to worship and develop a closer relationship with God. Another area that is going extremely well in the congregation, is that adults of the congregation express sincere interest and care for the youth of the congregation. Youth have said that it is nice to have adults come up and talk to them. These caring adults keep in touch with them and show that they care about their lives.

Some reflections regarding improvements in the youth programming were comments stating that there were no offerings for Middle Schoolers outside of Confirmation. Others said the youth are going to have a very difficult time transitioning from previous staff to the new one. Others said that youth activities are weird and only suited for a few youth and not all. The church service on Wednesday evenings were not well attended and made it feel like the church group was small. Dinner was also a problem for families, and adding dinner to Wednesday nights would help both the parents and bring youth together through a shared meal.

In regards to the name 'Safehouse,' overwhelmingly people thought the name gave off the wrong meaning. It made people think of a domestic violence shelter, children seeking safety from something or simply asking the question, *Safe from what...?*



The timeframe for the Wednesday evening offerings were mixed. Many families did not like the split timeframe for the ending of Middle Schoolers and High Schoolers, especially in the winter months with poor driving conditions. Others suggested Sunday afternoon offerings instead of Wednesday evening.

In conclusion, many of these suggestions will be implemented this coming year. Starting with how Wednesday nights are framed. It has been a while since you have heard from your Our Redeemer's Lutheran Church Property Development Team, but progress is still being made behind the scenes. As you may recall, OUR REDEEMER'S LUTHERAN back in March of this year Rocky Mountain Development Council (RMDC) was allotted \$1.58 million in ARPA funding by the Helena (RMDC) was allotted \$1.58 million in ARPA funding by the Helena City Commission towards the Our Redeemer's affordable housing

project. Since then, agreements have been put into place between RMDC and the city about the utilization of these funds. This spring, RMDC was also invited by our County Commissioners to make an application, on behalf of this project, for \$500,000 of federal grant funding. As of August, the county is still assessing internal expenses and has not yet designated this money. Currently, the ORLC Property Development Team is engaged in conversations with RMDC to outline each party's expectations related to the transfer of property for affordable housing.

It is likely that legislation passed during this latest legislative session has changed the expected process for subdivision, simplifying and shortening the process required prior to sale of a portion of the ORLC property to RMDC. SB 170 allows for an administrative minor subdivision process for properties located in an area subject to and complying with zoning regulations, have a letter of commitment from the municipality to serve the property with water and sewer service, have physical access to each lot, and do not require a variance. The administrative minor subdivision is exempt from several of the requirements of a typical subdivision process, thus greatly shortening and simplifying this process. Our consulting engineer believes that the first subdivision of the ORLC to prepare the portion of the property for sale to RMDC can comply with this simplified subdivision process.

While the engineers develop an understanding of this new subdivision process, the church's attorney is drafting preliminary language for a buy-sell agreement, outlining each party's obligations and expectations. Any negotiated sale of the property will require approval by congregational vote.

At one point in the documentary "Lakota Nation vs. United States," which recently played at the Myrna Loy Center, an Indian activist describes the Lakota tribe's efforts to reclaim its sacred territory of the Black Hills as a "beautiful struggle." What a strikingly marvelous description. After more than a century of resisting seemingly irresistible forces, the Lakotas persist. It is an interminable fight against incredible injustice that has caused incalculable suffering. But it's not just a struggle; it's a *beautiful* struggle. The goal is what makes the struggle beautiful. The goal is to right past and present wrongs; to reconcile people who have long been at war,

literally and virtually; to promote healing; and to preserve and honor what is sacred.

Struggle is our active resistance against an opposing force to create a reality different from the one that would emerge absent the struggle. We all struggle in many ways throughout our days and lives. We expend much of our energy trying to shape our own realities. But God has revealed to us Christians an ultimate, eternal reality: a reality of love that has resisted and defeated the power of death and that creates life wherever it goes.

In one sense, then, we no longer have to struggle. The reality of God's creation, of which we are part, is perfect, everlasting goodness. God has struggled for us against the infection of sin and has reclaimed us to live in the shelter of God's love. The work is finished ... and the work is ongoing. That's the weird thing about eternity; it's not linear. Sin and death have been defeated, and yet they are still very much active in this world. So God invites us to join forces with God's Spirit and with each other to sow seeds of love that will crowd out death and replace it with life.

That is the struggle in which we engage at Our Redeemer's. We struggle joyfully together to help feed the poor, to educate young and old about God's reality, to remind one another in the midst of death and sickness of the everlasting life that God has graciously bestowed. We struggle together to embody the reality of God's kingdom by sheltering the unsheltered, by giving sacrificially and joyfully of the resources God has given us, and by directing our lives and our energies toward struggles aimed at enriching not only ourselves but others as well. We struggle to illuminate the darkness with the light of God's grace.

That, truly, is a beautiful struggle.


