

Comment on the Draft Social Statement on Women and Justice

The ELCA task force that is responsible for the writing of the ELCA's social statement on

Women and Justice is still receiving feedback through September 30. Feedback can be sent through an online (http://www.elca.org/womenandjustice) paper survey form (ask Pastor Kendra for a copy) or through letters (Evangelical Lutheran Church in America/8765 W. Higgins Rd./Chicago, IL 60631) and emails (womenandjustice@elca.org). Our congregation hosted a hearing in May and two study sessions in July.

St. John's Lutheran Ministries Followup:

A meeting of members who had expressed interest in following up with St.John's Lutheran Ministries was held on May 23. A decision was made at that time to visit the St. John's campus to more closely examine the benefits Atonement Lutheran church, Billings, MT received through their association with St. John's and the facility, Wyndstone located on their campus.

On July 17, Linda Nelson, Mark Redfern, Bonner Armstrong, Pastor Arne and myself traveled to Billings and visited the St. John's campus and Wyndstone, an independent living with supportive services facility. Some of our questions were answered and others generated.

Additional discussion with St. John's was requested and held at ORLC on August 16, 2018.

Bonner Armstrong, Linda Nelson, Ron Pecarina, Jim Penner, Jerry Hoover, Mark Redfern, Danica Boe, Jeff Downhour, Autumn Keller, Pastor Arne and myself attended. Pastor Ulgenes of St. John's Lutheran Church, Helena was invited to sit in on our discussions.

A partnering arrangement with St. John's Lutheran Ministries was discussed and the group decided to investigate the different arrangements that could be had with St. John's Ministries and the several types of services that might be designed to operate and be beneficial to our community.

As discussions progress and ideas come forward, monthly meetings of this group and St. John's Ministries are planned with the next meeting scheduled September 20, 2018 at 11 AM at ORLC.



Council Meeting Summary - August 21, 2018

Financials – Giving in July was below the same period for 2017 as well as below 2018 plan. Although we are about \$67,000 behind plan for the year, several changes and adjustments have occurred to mitigate the financial situation. We currently have payables of approximately \$32,000, about \$24,000 of which is benevolence. There was a positive cash flow in July of \$2417. The council voted to accept the recommendation of the financial review committee and reimburse the building fund in this amount. Giving for Join the Journey was less than required for our monthly payment. The payment was made using reserve funds dedicated for that purpose.

Audit – Several actions have been accepted by the council regarding the 2016 audit report and additional items from the 2018 draft report have been addressed.

Columbarium – The final report for the columbarium was reviewed and accepted by the council. The recommendation from the columbarium committee to set aside the project due to a lack of congregational support was accepted but noted that this project would be tabled until a time when the financial ability to support the project improved.

Covenant to Care for Creation – Nelson Bock provided background information regarding a Covenant to Care for Creation, a document developed for the ELCA by Lutherans Restoring Creation.

Call for Carol Will – The council approved extending a call to Carol Will to serve as a deacon at Our Redeemer's pending congregational approval. The position is voluntary and focuses on adult faith development. Carol has provided several classes for adult education and is a leader of a Christ Care group. A congregational meeting is scheduled for September 9 following the 8:30 service.

Lay Pastoral Associates – The council voted to provide letters of recommendation for three people to enter the Lay Pastoral Associate program. Kevin Mathews, Lisa Williams-Mathews and Lori Bigwood-Pecarina have agreed to enter the two-year program.

St. John's Lutheran Ministries – A brief update was given regarding the recent meeting with St. John's Lutheran Ministries. The goal is to explore ways that Our Redeemer's and St. John's can work together to provide services and care to the Helena community. We are currently tasked with defining a general scope for our level of involvement and opportunities for service.

Future Council Meetings – Due to conflicts with my schedule, the council meetings for September and October have been rescheduled. The revised dates are September 11 (one week earlier) and October 23 (one week later). The meeting times remain at 6 pm.
