### Walking together in ministry....


### We've been on the journey for 60 years in 2019

### **Joint Thanksgiving Eve Service**

Lori Bigwood-Pecarina, Lisa Williams-Mathews, and I attended our first LPA retreat in Great Falls in early October. LPA stands for Lay Pastoral Associate. I didn't know what that meant, either, until recently. It turns out LPAs are a critical part of the Montana Synod. The Bishop licenses them on a case-by-case, as-needed basis to perform the roles of a pastor—except baptizing and conducting weddings—when a pastor is unavailable, which is not uncommon in many rural areas. To become an LPA, you need to complete a two-year curriculum of studying the old and new testaments, church history, and Lutheran theology. You also need to attend four, two-day retreats, work with a pastor mentor, and be a member of an ELCA congregation as well as complete 20 hours per year of continuing education after certification. Unlike Deacons (like Carol Will and Rob Stuberg), LPAs are tied strictly to their home synod. In other words, the Montana Synod Bishop can authorize one of her LPAs to work within and represent only the Montana Synod.

The Montana Synod program began in 1997. Several synods have something similar, but not all synods have a lay training program. The Montana Synod has about 100 active LPAs, with 35 people currently working toward certification. ORLC already has two LPAs in Jan and Jeff Martin; St. John's has one certified LPA and two just beginning the certification process. I asked Pastor Jason Asselstine, assistant to the Bishop and coordinator of the synod's LPA program, if the synod has a target number of LPA's they would like to achieve. He responded, "Our goal is to train everyone...however, if that doesn't work we will at least have one from each congregation in our synod."

Our first retreat, held at the Ursuline Center in Great Falls, focused on spirituality. Pastor Dan Heskett, from Northridge
 Lutheran Church in Kalispell, did a wonderful job of leading us in discussions about spirituality, guided meditative prayer,
 and a four-step contemplative bible study method. Here are a few highlights that stood out for me:

Christian spirituality can be thought of as:

- A way of life that is formed by the life and teaching of Jesus.
- Awareness—of God's presence in our present, of another dimension beyond the immediate material reality, something more.
- Christianity is both a noun (a set of beliefs) and a verb (those beliefs put into action).
- Christian spirituality must be lived out in community.
- Christian spirituality is much more than emotionalism and feelings.
- Spiritual disciplines are not spirituality, but they help train us to live spiritually, in sync with God.
- Recommended resource: "Celebration of Discipline" by Richard Foster.

Lori, Lisa, and I are looking forward to learning more over the next two years about the incredible gifts and mysteries we've been blessed to inherit. A big part of why we're doing this is to more effectively and confidently share that inheritance. So, please, if you have questions or would like to discuss this journey we all share, feel free to ask.

for the larger Helena community.



### Council Meeting Summary - October 23, 2018

**Financials** – Giving in September was above the same period for 2017 as well as 2018 plan. The council voted to use the remaining funds to reduce the payable (money borrowed from) the building fund. We currently have payables of \$773 toward the building fund and \$1412 toward council funds. We also owe about \$35,000 to benevolence. Giving for Join the Journey (our mortgage account) was also less than required for our monthly payment. We are now \$28,134 below plan for the mortgage account.

**Budget** – The budget for 2019 has been distributed to the council for review and recommendations. Although the budget is slightly less than the current budget, it will rely heavily on support for the ministries of the congregation. The council will have a special meeting to finalize the budget for congregation review on November 5. This will be followed by a budget forum between the services on November 11. An annual meeting to vote on the budget is planned for December 2.
