Gifts of the Holy Spirit and the Promise of Pentecost

In the days ahead, we will be celebrating the third great Christian holy day, the day of Pentecost. We remember that day when the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples. It is commonly understood as the birthday of the Christian Church. What does it look like to be people of Pentecost, claimed by the Holy Spirit?

People of Pentecost Claim Jesus as Lord

Every Sunday in worship, the people of Our Redeemer's reaffirm this core proclamation of our faith. As the Apostle's Creed is recited, we remember and proclaim our faith in Christ. It is through faith that we are empowered to make this claim. In explaining the Apostles Creed, Martin Luther reminds us that, "I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him, but instead the Holy Spirit has called me through the gospel, enlightened me with his gifts and kept me in the one true faith... Faith is a gift of the Holy Spirit."

People of Pentecost Live Out the Gifts of the Spirit

The Apostle Paul in 1 Corinthians 12 wrote, "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit..." When we think of spiritual gifts, we often think of those talents, abilities and passions that a person has for living out their faith. Scripture lifts up nine gifts of the Holy Spirit. These gifts are: words of wisdom, words of knowledge, faith, gifts of healings, miracles, prophecy, distinguishing between spirits, and tongues. Some of these gifts may seem strange to us and some may seem to be missing from the church. In faith, we may know that the Holy Spirit works mysteriously to gift the church for the good of the Gospel.

People of Pentecost Have Talents for Ministry

The Holy Spirit is active in all people who have faith. There are no haves and have nots; people of Pentecost are gifted by the Holy Spirit. Every faithful person has talents, abilities and passions for ministry. In using those talents for the good of the church, they become gifts of the Holy Spirit. In using those abilities, God is at work with grace and mercy for the whole world. Talents, abilities, passions are transformed as gifts of the Holy Spirit to be God's hands and feet in the world.



The draft social statement on "Women and Justice," which our congregation read and responded to last year, has been reviewed by the ELCA and a recommended proposed social statement renamed, "Faith, Sexism and Justice: A Lutheran Call to Action" has been released. It may be downloaded from the <u>elca.org</u> website.

The next step in the process for the social statement is for it to be considered by the Churchwide Assembly this August. To become an official social teaching of the ELCA, the document must be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the Churchwide Assembly. Mortgage Matching Challenge.

Financials - On behalf of the council, I say thank you for your financial support. Giving in April was very good, as it was \$8,286 over the budget plan (two months in a row). The council voted to pay the benevolence for April and a portion of the benevolence for January. Since May is a month with higher bills (insurance, youth programs), a portion of the funds were retained to cover expenses for May if necessary. Sufficient funds were held in reserve from last year to pay taxes. Giving for Join the Journey (our mortgage account) was less than required to meet our April payment. We received a generous donation of \$62,500 to reduce the principal on our mortgage and \$6,520 in matching funds which we sent to Mission Investment Funds.

Ministry Teams - The council approved the list of automatic payments. Staff will review the DEX account for our listing in the yellow pages. We are currently in discussion with Carroll College to permit them to use a portion of our property for a community garden and interdisciplinary study area. The intention is for the college to use the property with no financial commitment from the congregation. Pastor Arne will continue to work with the college to address concerns and finalize details. The college hopes to use the area next year. We are continuing our discussions with St. John's United for developing our property in conjunction with the mission of our congregation. There are still a number of tasks to be completed, but the plan is to have forums with the congregation in the fall.

Preschool – The preschool presented its budget for the coming school year. The contribution from the congregation remains as is at \$587 per month as support for the preschool director. This budget was passed by the council.
