THE VOICE

"Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received" (1 Peter 4:10).

We are entering into our annual stewardship emphasis entitled, "Faithful Stewards of God's Infinite Grace." During the next few weeks, we will consider what it means to be a "faithful steward" and how our stewardship translates into practical Christianity.

This emphasis is built in its entirety on two concepts: First, God owns everything! As Psalm 24:1 state clearly, "The earth is the Lord's and everything in it." God owns it all and has never relinquished the title deed to the world. Second, our responsibility is to manage that which belongs to God which God has entrusted to us. In other words, all that we have is a blessing from God and represents that which God has loaned to us on a temporary basis.

What kinds of things belong to God? Certainly, our time is a gift from our God that is given to everyone equally. All of us have the same amount of time - 24 hours per day. How does our faith impact the way we use our time, talents and possessions? What we do and how we do it is a proclamation of what we hold to be true.

God gifts us in so many ways. Our talents are also gifts on loan from God. Not everyone receives an equal amount of talents or abilities, but all of us can excel at something. Some are called to a public ministry whereby what they do is highly visible, including pastors, worship leaders and teachers. Others are called to a less visible role in the ministry and work of the church. But all of us are given talents and abilities which can be used for God's glory and to strengthen the Gospel outreach here at Our Redeemer's.

In our emphasis on stewardship, we recognize not only how our gifts can be used to support the ministry of our congregation, but how they can make a difference in our community as well. Your participation in that ministry is a part of God's call and it is deeply appreciated by your family members here at Our Redeemer's as we do ministry in the name of God's love. Together we can celebrate how our gifts are making a difference in the world. I encourage you to consider making a pledge to your church home as a part of the many ways that you live out your faith.



Council Meeting Summary - August 19, 2019

Financials – Giving in August was below plan resulting in a negative cash-flow of \$6051 before paying benevolence. Giving for Join the Journey (our mortgage account) was below that required to make the monthly payment (fifth time this year). The decision was made to establish council payables to account for the shortfalls.

Meet Phyllis Bauer

Phyllis C. Mount was born at home on the farm near Northport, NE in 1922, a *few* years ago. Phyllis was the baby of the family, the 8th of 8 children born to her parents. She had 3 older brothers, one of whom died in infancy, and four older sisters. Today, Phyllis is the only survivor.

The farm was reasonably small by Montana standards. It was a homestead farm and her parents raised sugar beets, had dairy cows, chickens, of course, and an occasional pig.

Phyllis went to school in Northport for 8 grades, but for the sake of this article, early in grade school, she began sewing at home on a Singer treadle sewing machine. She was in 4-H and one of the classes her leader taught was sewing.

A few folks will remember that those were tough days. The "dirty 30s" hit when Phyllis was about 8, and most people scrambled to keep food on the table. Fabric was beyond most budgets, but kids needed clothes. What to do? Some of us are old enough to remember that the flour millers saved the day! Flour was sold in 50# bags, and the millers were thoughtful enough to sell the flour in print sacks. Phyllis made her own dresses.

In high school, Phyllis took a "Normal Training" course. It qualified her to teach in a rural school for a period of 2 years, -- she taught for 1, --8 grades and outhouses.

From there, it was on to Chadron State College for 2 years, and an elementary teaching certificate. She taught a while, went to Washington D.C. at a friend's invitation for a couple of years, and when a sister died, moved back west to be closer to her family. She ended up in the Denver area, hired as a service representative for the phone company, overseeing an area of phone lines as monitor and trouble-shooter to a bunch of 8 party lines.

She met and married Walt Bauer in Denver, CO, in 1948. and when the first child arrived, lost her job because of the pregnancy. She got a job working for J.C. Penny, later, sewing drapery,



(no surprise). She migrated to sewing for upholstery, and eventually, did the upholstering as well. That job terminated at the onset of cancer, and chemo therapy. In the midst of therapy she moved with Walt to Bozeman, MT. She got a job sewing backpacks for Dana Designs in Bozeman.

Later, retirement (sort of), Phyllis and Walt moved to Helena to be near their son, Ron. Now, 97, Phyllis sews quilt top after quilt top for Lutheran World Relief. As she sews, she creates stories in her imagination of the children who will be kept warm by the quilts.

Phyllis fusses that she can't do more!? And she speculates that her life has been 'mundane,' but to a child somewhere in the world, warm under one of Phyllis' quilts, her life has been and continues to be precious indeed.

P.S. Karen Darlow, Rose Oelkers, Helen Bunkowske, and Delores Rosin share Phyllis' passion for quilting. Altogether they make us all proud. They have their own stories.

Ten years from now they will probably not be able to still make quilts. So who will make the quilts after them, assuming there may still be a little girl in the world who needs to be warm?
