"Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received" (1 Peter 4:10).

In our last article as part of this year's stewardship emphasis, we saw that God is the owner of everything and that we are managers and stewards of what God has given us. 

Council Meeting Summary - October 15, 2019

Financials – Giving in September was above plan for both general fund and building fund. The council voted to repay borrowed funds with the surplus funds. We currently owe \$27,684 for benevolence.

Property Assessment – The council voted to use funds in the account designated for Horseshoe Bend improvements to pay the property assessment that are due in November. The actual amount of the assessment will be known at the end of October. Steps have been taken to reduce the liability for the assessments as presented during a meeting on October 13.

Youth Mission Trip – The council revisited aspects of the summer servant trip for 2020. To be clear, the council has never said no for the international trip. We only ask that Jackie work with the youth and parents to meet defined mission goals. Any general funds for mission trips must be requested through the budgetary process.

Communication – The council will work on improving communication with staff, particularly as it relates to requests for council action.

Personnel Committee – The committee is updating job descriptions for non-rostered staff. We are seeking at least one more person to serve on this committee.

Nominating Committee – Eric Spangenberg is the chair of this committee. Lori Chase and Tami Ellis have volunteered to assist. There are five members who are completing their terms in January. We ask that people interested in serving on council contact any of the three. We will be looking for three officers and one or two atlarge members.

Facilities Use Policy - The facilities use policy has been updated and approved by the council.

Other Policies – The council reviewed and approved policies for money counting, purchase orders, and record keeping.

Preliminary Budget – The council was provided with the first draft of the 2020 budget for review. The draft is lower than the current budget but will require further adjustments based on actual assessments and other budget items. A budget forum and congregational meeting are planned for December.


