We will be offering communion outdoors to


residents at Touchmark the first and third Tuesdays of the month while the weather holds and precautionary conditions allow. Our Touchmark worship team will be in touch with residents with details.

Dear Friends and Supporters of Helena Community Connections' (HCC) Programs:

We pray that you have been safe and well during the past few months as the Coronavirus rocked our world.

We have missed seeing you at our four programs, Bridges Buffet, Cranium Café, Gentle Ways and My Destiny.

Normally, HCC would be planning fall 2020 programs, however, HCC now faces uncertainty about containment of the virus and when groups can resume in person events.

You may already know that AARP National has cancelled all in person events for the remainder of 2020. AARP Montana sponsors Bridges Buffet and that means we must follow its lead and also cancel ours.

Additionally, Covenant United Methodist Church remains closed to outside groups until at least Phase 3 is declared by Governor Bullock.

HCC will continue to keep you informed as more is known. HCC hopes to resume Bridges Buffet in January, 2021. Gentle Ways and Cranium Café may be able to begin again once Covenant becomes available.

In the meantime, HCC is exploring the idea of taping some video presentations that could be posted on www.bridgeshcc.org. Please keep checking the HCC website, events tab, for program availability.

HCC hopes to plan a one-day workshop for Spring, 2021 on leaving a personal legacy, both financial and non financial.

#### Update on Family Promise

Family Promise continues to serve the needs of homeless families in our community. The need is now greater than ever, and the churches in our community are doing their best to assist their neighbors. Some changes have taken place, however. All families are now housed at First Christian Church. Evening meals are delivered there by the host churches, as boxed meals or sack suppers for each family. Meals are provided on paper plates. Volunteers from host churches are housed on a separate floor, with separate bathroom facilities for families and volunteers. The host church also provides toilet paper, paper towels, hand sanitizer and bottled water for the guests. A number of safety protocols are also in place to ensure the safety of all concerned.

Our Redeemer's will host the week of September 6<sup>th</sup>. We are especially in need of 14 volunteers (2 per night) who will arrive at 6:00pm and stay until 7:00am the following morning. We will also need volunteers who can prepare and deliver meals for the families. We are also blessed that this church and especially the church council have supported us in our planning for this unique start to the school year.

Our staff this year is a blend of new and returning teachers. Emily Haerter and Jan Kiely are both joining us this year and will each be teaching three-year-old classes. We are also excited to announce that Taylor Jenks, a recent Capital High School grad will be our assistant, serving as a classroom helper, handwashing monitor, temperature taker, room sanitizer, and wherever needed.

We are also blessed to welcome back Audra Shropshire to teach two sessions of four-year-old classes and Wendy Vukonich who continues to teach both morning and afternoon pre-kindergarten classes. Trudy Burke continues to serve as Director.

#### **Council Meeting Summary – July 21, 2020**

The Church Council met on Tuesday, July 21, 2020 at 6pm. The agenda and minutes from June were approved by the council.

 Beth Johnson, Council Treasurer and Sarah Magee, Director of Finance and Facilities gave a financial report. It was stated that we are holding our own considering reduced services due to COVID.

• The council then listened to a detailed and thorough presentation from the Facility Development Team subgroup which included Bonner Armstrong, Jerry Hoover and Gretchen Krumm. During the last six months, the group has pursued various avenue for prioritizing the development of the church property. They have had detailed discussions with three organizations that share our views on the importance of meeting those community needs as identified by the November 2019 charrette survey. With the church council approval, a congregational presentation on our property development will be offered on Sunday, August 23<sup>rd</sup>, at 7pm. The presentation will most likely be done through live stream on YouTube which will allow members to participate and make comments.

• The status of the Business Adaptability Grant was discussed. The grant for \$4.082.40 was successful and those funds will be used to reimburse the church for audio visual equipment used for live streaming. Pastor Arne stated his concerns about how long the pandemic may last and the congregation not receiving the benefits and support from our ministry, especially those who are home bound and those who do not feel comfortable coming to church. Pastor Kendra voiced concerns about meeting the spiritual, physical and emotional needs of congregants and sees us pivoting away from "ministry as usual" to "ministry as unusual."

 Trudy Burke, Pre-School Director, and Craig Erickson, Council President, are working on a \$10,000 Social Services Nonprofit Grant. If awarded, it will cover the cost of pre-school supplies, personal protective equipment due to COVID, and a classroom assistant. The grant application is being prepared to submit.

• The job description for Jackie Bartz, the Director of Youth & Family Services was approved by the council, as was updates to the Family Leave Policy.

 Pastor Arne discussed the committees of the congregation and asked that council members review and consider serving on one or two of the committees.

• The last agenda item was the approval of credit card limits and it was noted those limits have not changed in years.
