



You've probably seen Kalley in the nursery loving and caring for youngsters on Sunday mornings once or twice a month – a super important role! But there's so much more! She's completed the Bronze and Silver Awards in Girl Scouts and will complete requirements for Gold this July. Her Bronze project was building and installing a Little Free Library near the Frozen Moose. She painted bathroom stalls at Rossiter School, including encouraging quotes in each. "Accidents happen – that's why they make erasers!" among others for elementary grades and quotes from Harry Potter for the higher grades. She's presently leading the painting of backstops at Helena High softball fields (Frank Mihelish field and Ramey Park) and installing crushed granite landscaping bordered by green-treated lumber around the dugouts and concession stand for her Gold Award project.

Kalley led the ORLC effort to build and ship 247 Personal Care Kits for Lutheran World Relief before the Covid lockdown. The youth collected towels, nail clippers, combs, soap bars and toothbrushes for the kits. She was aided by Lori Bigwood-Pecarina, who requested a Thrivent Action Grant to purchase some of the needed materials. She's been an active leader in youth activities, helped with Kid Packs at Helena Food Share, and participated in a skit to promote the Summer Milk Campaign fundraising effort. What an inspiration she is to all of us – and especially the young people who follow in her footsteps!

ORLC Perpetual Fund

The ORLC Perpetual Fund was established by the congregation in 1991. Based on the ORLC constitution, the church council appoints five trustees with a maximum two consecutive three year terms. The Perpetual Fund is currently comprised of three sub-funds. Per the 2021 annual report. invested balances in the funds were \$91,894 for the General Fund, \$148,723 for the Seminary Scholarship Fund, and \$109,018 for the Debt/ Maintenance Fund. All monies are invested through the ELCA national church investment operation and annual earnings (excluding market value changes) are available for grants that meet Perpetual Fund bylaw requirements. The bylaws read, "distributions should be made with particular emphasis on extending the life and mission of the church which would include but not be limited to: Missions of the ELCA at home and overseas, outreach into the community, or scholarships or grants to members of ORLC for the purpose of attending an ELCA seminary or for other church-related education. The debt/Maintenance Fund distributes 95% of its annual earnings to church debt or to the reserve for maintenance if no debt exists and 5% back to principle to offset inflation. Grant funds remain available for 2022 particularly from the General Fund. Grant applications are available from Lori at church. REQUIRED MINIMUM DISTRIBUTIONS

Individuals who are 72 years of age or older and have a **traditional IRA**, **SEP IRA**, **401K** or **403(b)** are required to take annually a minimum required distribution from those assets. Owners can choose to donate annually up to \$100,000 directly to a charity (ORLC qualifies and would offset normal low summer giving) and satisfy the RMD requirement AND exclude the RMD distribution from adjusted gross income thus avoiding taxation of the RMD. Consult your tax adviser if you have any questions.

Summer Milk Campaign

We have a couple of months to go to reach our \$6000 goal for the summer milk campaign for Helena Food Share. As of mid-June, we had received about \$500. These funds are necessary for providing milk for the Kid Pack program for the upcoming school year. And our deadline for the matching funds is August 31. So keep those coins, bills, checks, and online contributions coming our way. You may leave cash at the display in the hallway outside the sanctuary, or put checks in the offering, with Milk Money on the memo line. Online contributions may be made through www.ourredeemerlives.org. Just follow instructions for giving on the menu. Once you locate online giving, scroll down to the Milk Money tab. And thanks to everyone who provides so generously for the hungry in our community.

God's Love

As of mid-June, all beds at God's Love were full, and overflow guests were housed on cots in the dining room for the evenings. Because of inflation and unpredictable weather this summer, many people still seek the shelter of God's Love. The organization is especially grateful to Helena Food Share, Costco, and Pads for Paws. All these organizations supply necessary products and transportation of needed items to God's Love on a regular basis.

However, God's Love continues to have urgent needs, and they remain grateful for all the help that Our Redeemer's has provided for their population. Urgent needs include the following:

- ♦ Cleaning products: bleach, Pine Sol, Lysol (liquid) for sterilizing surfaces daily
- V Hygiene products: disposable razors, toothpaste, toilet paper, feminine hygiene products
- ♦ First aid supplies: hydrogen peroxide, rubbing alcohol, Tylenol, aspirin, Excedrin
- ♦ Socks (any kind): Clean socks are essential to keep feet healthy.
- Summer clothing items, including shoes. Used items are fine.

These donation items should be placed in the hamper outside the sanctuary doors.

♦ Fresh fruits and vegetables are also needed and can be dropped off directly to God's Love.

You may never receive a physical "Thank you" from these persons who are struggling day to day, but know that they are grateful. The Hunger Team cannot do any of this work without you. Thank you from the bottom of our hearts.



Council Meeting Summary June 21, 2022

Attending: Pastor Trina Johnsten, Lynn Voss (President), Kevin Mathews (First Vice President), Cody Salo (Second Vice President), Beth Johnson (Treasurer), Sarah Magee (Director of Finance and Facilities), Ingrid Childress (Secretary), Clint Mingay, Julie Penner, Tom Johnson, and Tracy Moseman (Members at Large). Excused: Jan Martin (Past President) and Carolyn Meyer (Member at Large).

Lynn Voss called the meeting to order. Pastor Trina Johnsten opened the meeting with devotions and prayer.

Beth and Sarah presented the financial report for the month of May. Receipts for the General Fund totaled \$38,682 which was almost \$4,000 less than May 2021 and \$28,514 less than the 2022 plan (which includes the property tax and a second pastor). Building Fund donations for May totaled \$8,311 which was \$230 less than last year and \$2,622 less than the 2022 plan. Building Funds and Council Funds have NOT been sent to Mission Investment for May, leaving a positive cash balance of \$7,839.85. Benevolence for May is \$1,934.20; total still owed is \$5,318.50 for the year.

Council approved that half of the Building Funds (\$4,155.49) be forwarded to Mission Investments and to hold the remaining Building Funds, Council Funds and Benevolence.

Pastor Trina reported that Sarah Magee will now be responsible for doing all financial tasks for the Preschool.

Minutes from the May Council meeting were approved.

Pastor Trina reported that she and staff are in the process of program planning and development for fall.

Kristine Thatcher has been hired as Interim Director for the Preschool and a teacher has been hired for the morning class of four year olds. Tracy Moseman volunteered to serve on the Preschool Advisory Board, representing the Council and the Congregation.

Pastor Trina reported that she and Kevin Mathews provided new member training for five family units in June.

Cody Salo reported the Property Development Team met to discuss possibilities for some type of market or coop on the grounds under development plans. He further reported that the Architectural Report is final and will be posted on the ORLC and City websites. He said additional communication will be forth coming this summer to keep the congregation and neighborhood updated as plans develop.

Members of the Generosity Committee have pledged to increase their summer pledges by \$25 - \$50 each month and challenged the Council members to do the same. Challenge accepted! The Challenge will be posted in the Voice and E-News for church members to do the same, as they are able.

Lynn announced the Perpetual Fund committee received and approved two Seminarian Grants. Interest earned on the Principle Funds are available for use; if not used the funds will be rolled back over into the Principle. Perpetual Funds are restricted, but can be used for program and staff development.

Cody reported the Spectrum Proposal Package for a replacement phone system has changed. Cody, Sarah and Lori will meet with the Technician again to get a new quote. The rate change will delay our decision.

Lynn reported that the Ukraine Benefit Concert raised over \$25,000. Also the church received a correspondence from Intermountain Children's Home thanking ORLC for sponsoring the Fortenberry concert.

We still need one more money counter.

Kevin agreed to work with a small team to prepare better signage for the church buildings' rooms along with some directions. Exterior entrances need signage as well.

Council members agreed to help the Hospitality Team by signing up to serve as coffee hosts and/or greeters.

Kevin is in the process of identifying and appointing this year's Audit Team.

ORLC was well represented at the Synod-wide Assembly in Billings this year. Lynn, Kevin and Tracy were there and reported on some of the breakout sessions they attended. There is potential to offer similar sessions to the congregation as adult education opportunities in the fall.

The Gifts and Memorial Committee will be tasked with preparing guidance for Gift Giving.
